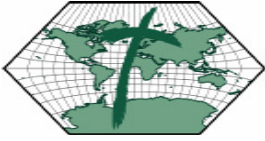

Freedom is Not Free

This past December, I had the opportunity to visit my son's family in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. Ron and I had a wonderful time visiting with Tim's family and attempting to spoil those grandkids a little more. We had the wonderful opportunity to see and visit several historical places. However, the USS ARIZONA Memorial (pictured below) was one place I particularly wanted to make sure I visited. It was very sobering to visit the memorials museum and hear great stories of heroism and see many artifacts treasured by the young men they honor. The tour was very informative but the actual visit to the memorial was very emotional. The memorial sits atop the sunken ship that took with it the lives of 1,177 young men. As I walked through the open air sanctuary built to immortalize these men I couldn't help but think of the great loss the families must have felt on that day, December 7, 1941. At the far end of the memorial the name of every man was engraved on the wall as an act of remembering each man. I couldn't help but notice the large number of people visiting that day and being impressed with how quiet and reverent everyone was being. I remember thinking to myself the familiar quote often found on bumper stickers, "freedom isn't free".



I am reminded as we celebrate our nation's birthday of the sacrifice made by many so that we all can enjoy the rights and freedoms paid by these heroes. I am also reminded of the great sacrifice our Lord Jesus Christ made on the cross of Calvary to atone for the sins of humanity. Because of His ultimate sacrifice, we are able to stand in the presence of a Holy God forgiven. Forgiven, not because of anything we did for ourselves, but because of what Christ did for us.



In celebration of our nation's birthday, let us be grateful to those who have and are currently paying a price for our American liberties. But let us also be reminded of the price Christ paid for us two thousand years ago. Let us remember today and always, "FREEDOM IS NOT FREE". **GOD BLESS AMERICA** is my prayer!
