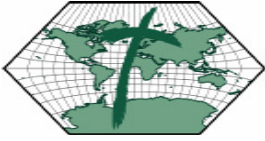

## The Heart of Discipleship

Paul reveals what I believe is at the heart of Discipleship in Philippians 3:10 when he says that he wanted to know Christ in three areas, His PERSON, His POWER and His PASSION.

These three areas became the three focal issues of Paul's life as a disciple — That I might know Him, that is, everything about Him, His teaching, His works, His life. Paul was obsessed, nothing else mattered, he counted all things as loss for the superior knowledge of Christ.

*Philippians 3:7 - . . . but what things were gain to me, these I have counted loss for Christ . . .*

Paul wanted to know His resurrection power, that which brings life in what would otherwise lead to death. Paul wanted to know His Passion, everything about His cross, that is the fellowship of His suffering. He wanted to know and understand better why the Son of God would die for him.

Making these three the focus of our pursuit of Christ will lead to our success as a Disciple.
